Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"Improvise, adapt, and overcome." This phrase is part of the U.S. Marine Corp purpose statement. It is also a Clint Eastwood line from the movie, *Heartbreak Ridge*. The concept is quite obvious: when facing new and difficult circumstances, one must adjust the plan in order to succeed.

Since faced with the unforeseen challenges presented by the coronavirus, Holy Lamb has shown an amazing willingness and ability to improvise, adapt, and overcome. At the beginning, we thought this would last a few weeks, then months. Now some are saying we should prepare to wear masks for another year. The need to improvise, adapt, and overcome has not passed. More than simply an opportunity, we have an obligation to continue to be creative in our ministry to each other and the community.

To briefly recap: our worship services have been live online and recordings available online since March; then we developed 'parking lot distribution' of the Lord's Supper; in June we began worship outdoors, and subsequently managed to have communion on the lawn, also (be sure to read more on that below); our Bible studies are available live on

Zoom and, by request, as recordings; our administrative meetings are being held on Zoom; our social organizations have had a few gatherings on Zoom or outdoors on the property. We have shown a determined commitment to continuing and even expanding our ministry in the face of this challenge – we have improvised, adapted, and overcome.

As we enter the colder months of the year, the challenges change. Worshiping on the lawn will become uncomfortably cold; social gatherings outdoors will also be impractical. At the same time, the cold weather will keep us inside even more than the virus already has. All of this creates new challenges – new opportunities to improvise, adapt, and overcome.

As I said earlier, we have an obligation to rise to the occasion. The church is more than a group gathered for worship; it is a community, an organism. St. Paul calls the church the 'body of Christ.' A body needs all of its parts functioning together to be all that God created it to be. We are obligated to provide sufficient opportunities, not only for worship and Bible study, but also for fellowship, in order for each part of this body to thrive.

So, as we move forward over the next several months, watch for new opportunities in worship, as well as fellowship. Some options include:

Extremely local FM radio broadcast of our worship services. This would broadcast our service across our parking lot, enabling worshipers to remain in their cars with the windows rolled up and the heat on, while listening on the car radio, viewing our worship live, and receiving the Lord's Supper in their vehicle. These FM transmitters sold out immediately when the virus hit. They are available now, and I have one on order.

Fellowship gatherings on the lawn. There have been two casual meals on the lawn for specific groups. I believe we still have time for a cookout before it gets too cold. Hamburgers, hot dogs, etc., along with corn hole, croquet, etc., would make for a fun afternoon/evening.

Fellowship on Zoom. One of the features of Zoom is the ability to break from the large group into small groups. These have worked well on the calls and conferences I have participated in on the district level. After a time of gathering in the large group, small groups (randomly assigned) are created and each participant is automatically placed in a group. We would have discussion-starter questions for the groups to stimulate the conversation. At a predetermined time, all participants rejoin the large group. This is a great way to renew friendships or create new ones. Some possible ideas: a Christmas Fellowship on Zoom, New Year's Eve Zoom Party (probable NOT to actually ring in the new year, although some may last that late), or just a time to gather to say, "Hi!"

If you have other ideas to improvise, adapt, and overcome, please let me know. If you have ideas for, or would like to help with, any of the ideas above, also contact me.

Now, more about our worship on the lawn.

In addition to the FM broadcast described above, we are eliminating the 'standardized' worship setting of every other Sunday. As I described in last week's Pause with Pastor, in order to take advantage of every 'good weather' opportunity, on Thursdays I will announce whether our worship will be outdoors, or exclusively online. This announcement will also be available on our website: holylambmyrtlebeach.org, on our Facebook page: Holy Lamb Lutheran Church LCMS, and on our office phone answering machine. Check any of these sources late Thursday to find out which worship setting applies for the following Sunday. While this may seem cumbersome, it seems to be the best way to ensure that we engage, in person, with each other as much as possible.

This new non-pattern, along with the FM feature, will allow us to gather on-site as long as we do not have precipitation and the setup and video crew is able to stand the cold. As most of you know, I prefer a cold Sanctuary for leading worship. Now we'll find out how much cold I can take ;-).

As Satan continues to throw obstacles at us, may God bless our improvisations and adaptations, empowering us to overcome, even as He has already overcome Satan in Christ's resurrection.

Our preschoolers are so happy to be back in school with their friends, having fun learning. With the COVID-19 challenges we have went to great links to return safely to school. Parents participate in a drop off loop where children are screened for symptoms, temperature is taken and emergency contact person is identified for the day by the staff.

Upon entering the building, the children must have a mask on, and sanitize their hands before taking their assigned seats in one of two classrooms as the 6 children are divided into two groups in separate classrooms. Masks are warn at all times while in the classrooms.The children's tables have plexiglass dividers with only four students per table and per room.Ms. Lynnette teaches the lessons for the day in one room while the other teacher teaches supporting activities in the other room. The teachers then rotate rooms for lessons. The children spend a great deal of time outside playing, learning and having snack.

All communications with the parents are conducted through email or text. With all the new procedures and social distancing in place, we had an unbelievable first day!
