Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 17th. During this season, Christians remember that our sins are what made it necessary for Jesus to die on the cross. The season is 40 days long, the same number of days Jesus was in the wilderness being tempted by Satan. However, if you count the days on a calendar, beginning on Ash Wednesday and ending on Saturday, April 3rd, the day before Easter, you will count 46 days. This is because the Sundays during the Lenten season are considered to be 'in' Lent, but not 'of' Lent.

This is a bold proclamation of the church that the overwhelming message of the Bible is the Good News of forgiveness and the promise of eternal life for all believers. This is so important that even during the penitential season of Lent, each Sunday is still a celebration of the resurrection of our Lord. Our Sunday services are slightly more subdued – we do not sing the Gloria in Excelsis or the Alleluias, or any hymns

with 'Alleluia' in them. And we don't have flowers on the shelf in the Chancel area. But our Sunday mornings, like every Sunday, are still a mini-Easter.

These clarifications underscore the value of our midweek Lenten services. These services *do* focus on the passion of our Lord. With a penitential tone they *do* remind us of our sin; and they *do* call us to repentance.

That penitential tone is heard, literally in the music of our Lenten hymns. Even more pointedly, that penitential message is heard in the words of our hymns. Which brings me to our midweek theme this year: *Hymns of Repentance and Joy*. Our sermons in these services will each dig into the lyrics of one of hymns, expanding on the words to provide a deeper understanding, even of the well-known hymns we have been singing for years.

I used this format for Advent once and the concept was very much appreciated. We may be very familiar with hymns, can even sing them from memory, perhaps. Yet, we often don't think about the words we are singing. In some cases, in order to make the rhythm and rhyme work, hymn-writers have used unusual word choices or word order, which can make comprehension difficult while singing. We will take time to examine these issues, explaining the meaning and context, so that our singing of the hymn becomes even more meaningful.

An added bonus this year is some variety in our preaching. Pastor Hollar and I are going to alternate our midweek preaching responsibilities between Risen Christ and Holy Lamb. We will both be doing hymns (we will be careful not to repeat any) but both congregations will be blessed by a different approach to our hymnody.

Unfortunately, it looks like we will not be back in our Sanctuary, at least at the beginning of Lent, and it will be too dark and cold to worship on the lawn. So we will join online at 7:00PM on Wednesdays. The bulletins will be emailed ahead of time, as we currently do for Sunday mornings.

As I was doing my Thursday Bible study, *Faith in Practice*, this quote was in the study and I would like to share it with you all.



"Everybody can be great because everybody can serve. You don't have to have a college degree to serve. You don't have to make your subject and verb agree to serve.....you only need a heart full of grace and a soul generated by love." Martin Luther King Jr.

In this light, the committee would like to thank all those in our congregation that serve in any way. We always have room for more volunteers to serve in many ways in the church and to others outside our church to show God's love. We have openings on the council. There is room for more prayer partners for *Praying in Color* and on the prayer chain. There is opportunity to serve as tech support for our worship services.

We invite you to join a Bible study. These are done on Zoom. We are studying Genesis on Tuesday mornings. On Wednesday evenings we are looking at 1 John and our Thursday night women's Bible study, is *Faith in Practice*. The next study will be the book of Esther. We have room for you.

In a recent Sunday service, we sang *Take My Life and Let it Be*. The first verse was "Take my life and let it be Consecrated, Lord to thee; Take my moments and my days. Let them flow in cease-less praise". And the hymn goes on about hands and voice, and feet and lips, and so on, willing God to use our lives for Him. Where is God calling you to serve Him?

We are excited to begin our next project, with your help – *Shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child* later this month. Shoeboxes will be available beginning February 21^{st} for you to take home and fill with items suggested monthly over the next 7 months. The beginning of each month a new group of suggestions will be on the board in the Narthex, the notes and the newsletter. You only need to purchase at least one (1) item off the list each month to put in your box. Some months you may want to purchase two (2) or three (3) items depending on the room



left in the box. When you pick up your box, you will decide to fill it with items for a boy or girl and of a specific age. In each box, is a tag which you will tape to the cover of the box after marking the age group. In addition to items suggested monthly, each box must contain \$9.00 in cash to help with shipping to the various countries from Samaritan's Purse. As you put an item in the box, a prayer can be said for the child that will be receiving this Christmas gift which may be the only gift they receive. In September, you will have a filled box that we will collect and bring to a collection center to go to Samaritan's Purse for distribution to children all over the world for Christmas 2021 and beyond.

The following items **CANNOT** be included in the boxes: Toothpaste; Candy; Gum; Chocolate; Fruit snacks; Used items; War related items; Liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; Breakable items or Aerosol cans.
