Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

If you have been monitoring the news regarding the coronavirus, you are aware of the significant improvement in numbers. If you have not been watching these numbers, let me give you some brief overviews:

- The daily 'new case count,' for both the state and Horry County, is dropping significantly.
- The other numbers (hospitalizations, ICU beds, ventilators, and deaths) are all dropping, as well.
- The number of people (especially our members) who have been, or are in the process of receiving vaccinations is increasing rapidly.

This is all good news for the community in general, for our congregation, and, specifically, for our desire to gather indoors for worship.

While we can look forward to that day being sooner rather than later, we must not forget that many in our congregation are not yet eligible to receive a vaccination. That *does not* mean that we must wait until all are vaccinated to resume some semblance of normalcy. It *does* mean that, as we begin the reopening process, we *do not reduce* the opportunity for those not yet vaccinated to participate safely. As we re-engage in person, indoors, we must continue to provide opportunities for those not vaccinated to remain engaged.

It is also important to note that those who are not eligible to be vaccinated now have the highest risk for infection' since they are the ones still in the workplace on a daily basis. A case in point: a member of Risen Christ, still employed, tested positive. He had no symptoms and only got tested because several coworkers tested positive. Just because the numbers are improving does not mean that the risk has disappeared. I urge you, who are now vaccinated, to remember the deep concern you had about public contact when you had the greatest risk, and realize that others are still in that position. This means that masks are still important. The medical community has not yet determined whether or not you are be able to carry and transmit the virus even if you are vaccinated and cannot contract it.

So, even with all the good news and the anticipation of reopening, we must remain vigilant.

At the same time, let's begin a discussion of what reopening the Sanctuary for worship looks like. Clearly, we still need capacity limitations; we still need masks; we still need careful attendance records for contact tracing; and we still need to allow for those who will not be able to join us in the Sanctuary for any of the following reasons:

Those who were not able to register for worship indoors because the registration was already full;

Those who are still uncomfortable in crowds due to non-vaccination;

Those who, even if vaccinated, prefer not to engage in close contact to avoid exposing coworkers.

We are all stewards of all God has given us. All that we have has come from God and he has charged us to

be good stewards of all. Each of us has a choice on what we do with what God has given us and what we do with our time. How much time do we spend in prayer, studying God's word alone, Bible study, participating in worship services or doing good deeds with our time?

Then there is our possessions and how we use them. I know when someone sees a *buy 1 get 1 free* while grocery shopping, they take the free one and donate it to a food bank (we have a basket in the narthex to donate food items) which we take to *Help for Kids* right down the road from us.

Lastly, we'll address our money. God has asked us to tithe, he does not command this, but leaves it up to us. We are a very blessed people . Through our church, we have many opportunities to be good stewards. We are in the Lenten season. Some people practice giving up something for Lent so that they can spend time in prayer. Some people decide to add a new practice to their routine to draw closer to God in this season. May I suggest adding Wednesday evening services to your week.

Given these necessary considerations, our reopening worship may actually have even more complexity than our non-indoor worship has. I can imagine worship indoors, with our PA system functioning for those on the lawn (perhaps watching on their phone or tablet), while also broadcasting on FM for those in their cars, and of course, Live streaming on FaceBook. Then the challenge of communion distribution arises. Of course, some of these contingencies would still be affected by the weather.

Now that I have laid out the various challenges, let me invite you to add your thoughts. If you have ideas for addressing some of the challenges above, please send me an email with your thoughts. I don't believe any one person has the full solution, just as no single person came up the operational plan we have now. It was the evolution of many ideas from many people. In opening up the discussion, now, I hope to hasten the process of coming to a workable, multi-faceted solution that meets the needs of our worshiping community.

As we move forward to this next step in dealing with the coronavirus, let's continue to be open to 'thinking outside the box.' And as we do so, recognize that not all the ideas will be compatible with each other, and some may not be workable. But even those ideas not used may trigger one that will.

Above all, let's remember that our purpose in worship is to receive the blessings of God in Word and Sacrament, and to respond in thankfulness and praise for all that he has done and continues to do in our lives, in the lives of others, and in our congregation.
