Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The word 'rejoice' appears in the Bible 914 times. Of course, a great number of those occurrences are in the Psalms, the hymnbook of the Israelites. From national deliverance from their enemies to personal deliverance from Satan, they and we have much over which to rejoice. And, now, it appears that we have one more thing to rejoice and thank God for: the plague of the coronavirus has been significantly diminished!

Our Elders and Council have regularly addressed the concerns on both sides of the debate, and have taken steps and then modified the guidelines in response to the concerns of the congregation and the reports of the medical community.

Early in this battle, when we had already suspended indoor activities and many were wondering what 'markers' would be used to determine re-entry, I suggested that a consistent 'new daily case count' in Horry County of 25 or less might be an example. I was not establishing that as

the standard; and just a few weeks later we were at 100-plus new cases per day. At that time, I thought a 25-per-day count was unattainable.

Now the cause for rejoicing. Since May 1<sup>st</sup>, the daily new case count has not been above 23. In fact, in that time it has only been at 20 or above twice. We are consistently seeing numbers in the single digits. And remember, this is for the entire county. There were times when our individual zip codes far exceeded these numbers. On top of that, the CDC has determined, based on data, that it is safe for vaccinated individuals to go without masks, even indoors.

A large majority of our members have already been vaccinated. And the vaccine is now approved for, and available to, all who desire to receive it. We still have several members who are not going to be vaccinated, on advice of their medical professionals, because of other health concerns and potential vulnerabilities. For their benefit, achieving what I believe can be described as a 'herd immunity' in our county can offer great comfort.

All of these points bring the question of our policies to the fore. Our Elders addressed the question of loosening our guidelines at their meeting on May 4<sup>th</sup>. They determined that, since enacting them was a decision of the Leadership Team (Elders and Council together), any significant modification should come from that same Team. At the May Council meeting they decided that the June Council meeting would be that Leadership Team meeting. In the meantime, the numbers have continued to improve, as I noted above.



The summer reading plan is very exciting: a look at how all sixty-six books of the Bible tell one unified story about God's love and purpose for humanity as well as His plan to rescue us.


Over the first seven weeks, beginning May 31<sup>st</sup>, we'll read thematic selections from every book of the Old Testament to see how they contribute to the greater narrative of Scripture, from the creation of the world to the establishment, captivity, and restoration of the nation of Israel. This study provides a framework for reading the Old Testament and a better understanding of its role in redemption history.

On July 19<sup>th</sup>, we'll begin a five week study tracing the redemption story through the New Testament.

If you're interested, but twelve weeks (during the summer!) sounds like too big a commitment, please note that you can join us as you are able—or not at all—and read the daily readings (they come out Monday through Friday so there's even two days per week to 'catch up') on your own schedule—even a week or more later. It's especially easy if you sign up for the daily emails—they're in your inbox whenever you're ready.

#### **2021 Hurricane Preparedness**

We are in the hurricane season. There are steps we can take to protect ourselves and our possessions.

First and foremost, it is important to monitor local weather reports and follow advisories from local authorities about preparation and evacuation.

#### Know your zone.

#### Zone A

All areas east of Business 17 up to the intersection with US 17

#### Zone B

All areas east of us US 17 bypass to US 17 All areas south of Hwy 707 and Longwood Drive All areas in Longwood Plantation (Blackmoor subdivision)

#### Zone C

All areas between Hwy 701 and Hwy 544 All areas east of Hwy 31 to Hwy 90 All areas east of Hwy 90 to US 17 in northern Horry County line

- Develop a family disaster plan.
- Prepare an Emergency Supply Kit. Make sure to stock or restock not perishable food items and replace batteries.
- Put copies of important documents in a safe place, preferably a water tight container.
- If you have prescription drugs, make sure to document the RX number, name, address and phone number of the pharmacy where you fill your prescriptions. Also record your administering doctor's name and phone number.
- Create an evacuation plan. Know your evacuation route and decide early when you will leave and where you will go.
- Identify an out-of-area emergency contact.
- Fill up the gas tank in case you have to evacuate.
- Have enough cash on hand for a few days because ATM's may not be available due to power outages.

Holy Lamb maintains an **Emergency Contact Sheet** for each of our families. Your elder will be contacting you to update your information or complete a new sheet.
