The coronavirus numbers for Horry County have been excellent! We have been well under 20 new cases per day for more than a month; we did not see an upward spike following Memorial Day; and there has been no overall increase with the rising tourist population.

I believe we can begin to see our experience with the pandemic in the rearview mirror. In doing so, we would do well to celebrate our successes, note and learn from our shortfalls (many are theorizing that this will happen again), and of course, mourn our losses. While I do not intend this column to be all-inclusive, I would like to highlight a few items:

1. Let's first acknowledge the two individuals close to Holy Lamb who went to glory as a result of Covid-19: Kim Babaie and Bob Gagliardi. How unfortunate that these deaths were overshadowed by the daily, blaring headlines, the seemingly endless debates, and our preoccupation with appropriate masks, distances, and activities.

We praise God for the faith of Kim and Bob, faith that assured them and assures us of their immortality in heaven; faith by which we are confident that we will see them with resurrected, recreated bodies in heaven.

2. Secondly, our shortfalls. I am probably the least qualified person to identify these because, as I encountered any shortfalls, I worked to address them as soon as possible. But I'm sure there are many that I was not aware of, or did not address as quickly as I should have.

Try as we did, I suspect there were many times when our communication could have been better. We certainly should have been more attentive to individuals who were seen infrequently – as opposed to those who regularly participated in worship, as well as those who were unable to join us in person at all. It was too easy to note that someone 'was here a few weeks ago' and check them off as doing okay and needing no further contact, rather than initiate a conversation or visit, recognizing some specific concern they might have.

3. Finally, we have much to celebrate and give thanks for! Last Sunday, at the congregational meeting, our Elder Chair, Tom Marquardt, read a litany of accomplishments over the last year. He did this in celebration of the 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary of my ordination and installation at Holy Lamb. To hear him talk, I accomplished all of this singlehandedly. Anyone at all familiar with the dramatic adaptations that have occurred over the past year knows that is not true. I was caught off guard by Tom's review and acclaim. The only specific reference I was able to recall was that Caroline, not I, had set up our Zoom account which enabled our meetings and Bible studies to continue online.

I would like to correct that oversight here. I will not list individual names because I'm sure I would miss someone – there were too many people to be able to remember every person I saw involved, and I'm sure there were many whose participation and assistance I did not personally witness.

So allow me to identify some of the obvious, significant steps we took, as well as some not-so-obvious but essential things that made Holy Lamb's continued ministry possible:

- a. One of the first things, and most noticeable, was our technology advances. We immediately began broadcasting on FaceBook Live with an iPhone. Then we received a Mevo camera via a grant from Lutheran Church Extension Fund. This involved a significant learning curve including merging/adding/improving audio capabilities, selecting and adapting to new equipment, upgrading our network and learning those new procedures.
  - All of this took a tremendous amount of time, experimentation, and practice, all while being prepared to provide the service every Sunday using our most recently gained knowledge, which often changed weekly. To the many, many volunteers who assisted and continue to assist with our audio and video production needs, I extend my warmest "Thank you!" Your commitment, in the face of challenging and changing circumstances enabled our members and guests, as well as strangers around the world (literally) to join us in worship.
- b. Early in the pandemic, someone suggested we worship on the front lawn. What a fabulous option this turned out to be. In addition to the technical details of audio and video, we now added a whole new sphere of needed volunteers setup and breakdown of our equipment, backdrop, and amenities for outdoor worship. Again, a lot of trial and error, adjusting from one Sunday to the next, to arrive at the most efficient steps to assemble all the necessary components. And all of this was subject to the whims of the weather: wind, overpowering sun, and rain, in any combination of the three.
  - Once again, our members rose to the occasion and assisted in great numbers. I was amazed at how quickly we could create a Chancel area on the sidewalk and then remove it all after worship. Your dedication and attention to detail made our outdoor worship a truly reverent experience much more than a minimally acceptable substitute for indoor worship. Of special note, is the work of grounds crew in preparing our lawn for worship. "Thank you!" to all who rolled or carried equipment, from sandbags to furnishings to backdrops, in order that we could celebrate the Gospel outdoors.
- c. Speaking of celebrating ... because of the efforts of our Altar Guild and Elders, we were able to celebrate the Sacrament every Sunday we worshiped in person. This includes celebrating on the lawn as well as our 'drive-thru' distribution when we not on the lawn. They managed to adjust to: a) the unique needs of 'touchless distribution' elements passed through vehicle windows; b) providing a full tray of cups in the middle of the lawn, as well as gathering the empty cups; and c) setting the communion-ware on the sidewalk or on the driveway, again dealing with potentially adverse weather conditions.
  - The work of the Altar Guild of any church is too often taken for granted. But when they miss a beat, it is 'up front' for everyone to notice. Our Altar Guild has gone way above and beyond in creatively and reverently addressing every need that arose as we celebrated the Sacrament at every opportunity. For your consistent, dependable, reverent service, I offer my personal and sincere, "Thank you."
- d. Finally, all this work by so many would have been to no avail had our members not been willing to think outside the box in worship, Bible study, and meetings. From group leaders and committee chairs who learned how to initiate and lead a Zoom meeting, to every member who attended on FaceBook, viewed on our webpage, sat in a lawn chair, or listened in our parking lot, our membership demonstrated a desire to worship and be in fellowship with each other that overwhelmed any personal objection to the manner in which we gathered.

This brings everything into alignment, making the book far easier to understand. ### Women's Bible Study

The women's Thursday night Bible study meets Thursday evenings at 6:30 on Zoom. All women are welcome to join us! Use Holy Lamb's standard meeting code.

We are using the reading plans provided at www.shereadstruth.com You can find the daily Scripture readings and devotion at their website or sign up for their daily email or download their app. The website and emails are free; some of the plans on the app have a nominal charge. There is also a weekly podcast that discusses that week's readings. We would love to have you join us! And whether or not you meet with us, this can be another easy way to develop a daily Bible reading habit. (For those men who are feeling 'left out', there is also a 'He Reads Truth' reading plan at the website!)

The summer reading plan is a look at how all sixty-six books of the Bible tell one unified story about God's love and purpose for humanity as well as His plan to rescue us.

We began our study on May 31 and we've covered the Pentateuch (Genesis-Deuteronomy) and the Historical books (Joshua-Esther). We're currently in the Wisdom literature (Job-Song of Solomon) and from June 25 through July 16, we'll be covering the Prophets (Isaiah-Malachi). We're reading thematic selections from every book of the Old Testament to see how they contribute to the greater narrative of Scripture, from the creation of the world to the establishment, captivity, and restoration of the nation of Israel. This study provides a framework for reading the Old Testament and a better understanding of it's role in redemption history.

We are excited and humbled by how much we are learning in this Old Testament survey about the character of our great God and His plan of redemption. It's not too late to join us! The upcoming weeks on the Prophets should be especially enlightening since most of the prophets' writings are unfamiliar to 21<sup>st</sup> century Christians.

On July 19, we'll begin a five week study reading selections from every book of the New Testament and see how each contributes to the greater narrative of Scripture, from Jesus' birth and ministry on earth to His triumphant return, giving us a framework for reading the New Testament and a better understanding of its role in redemption history.

*Interested but life's busy?* You can join us as you are able—or not at all—and read the daily readings on your own schedule—even a week or more later. (So, yes, you can still start at Genesis!)


