Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It is difficult to write a December newsletter article, with an appropriate focus on Christmas, 2 days before Thanksgiving. I have just determined what our Wednesday Advent worship series will be - I'm not even thinking about Christmas, yet. So, I will use this column to highlight some upcoming and new, or newly recurring, events and send out a special Pause with Pastor nearer our celebration of the birth of Christ. Please note all the following opportunities for worship and study, and join us where you are able.

If I finish this article on time, the first event will be tomorrow evening – our **Thanksgiving Eve worship** service at 7:00PM. I once heard a pastor say he didn't know how to preach on Thanksgiving, even suggesting that we shouldn't have a worship service because it wasn't a church holiday. That was 20 or more years ago, and I still don't understand the sentiment. The word 'thanksgiving' is used 105 times in Scripture, not including the word 'thanks' in all its other forms. In 1st Thessalonians Paul writes, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances." 'All circumstances' includes all those times when, due to extremely difficult circumstances, we find it diffi-

cult to find anything for which to be thankful. All the more reason to join in worship - to *make* time to remember and identify the many blessings we take for granted or simply overlook in trying times.

We are resuming our **Sunday morning Bible classes** this Sunday, November 28, at 9:15 with a 4-week study of the Incarnation. Join us as we explore one of the greatest mysteries on earth – the incarnation of Jesus Christ as God and man. Some of the questions we will address are: "What does incarnation mean?" "Why did God become man?" "Why not send an angel?" Where can God be found today?"

Our **Christmas Cantata** will be presented on Dec. 1st at 7:00. This will replace our usual Wednesday evening Advent service. With 16 voices from the choirs of Holy Lamb and Risen Christ, accompanied by 8 musicians, including a harp, along with several songs in which the congregation will join, this service of worship and song will be one to remember. Please join us.

Our **Wednesday Advent services** will be on Dec. 8, 15, & 22. We will consider the thoughts, words, and actions of 3 different groups: the family (included the extended family) of Jesus, the angels who announced the birth to the shepherds, and the Magi who traveled to see Jesus. While we do not encounter the latter 2 groups until after the birth of Jesus, their thoughts, words, and actions can confirm and enlighten our Advent preparations.

Our schedule for Christmas worship services is as follows: Christmas Eve 7:00PM only Christmas Day – 10:00AM Sunday, December 26th, 9:30 only

Stewardship

When I first took Stewardship, I spent the first four or more newsletters putting in what stewardship means. I had one article last month and this month, I an using "Stewardship a Way of Life". What does that mean in our daily life? Say on Monday you get up do your morning devotion while having coffee and you throw a load of wash in. You get a phone call from a friend that needs to talk to you so you give that person your full attention. You finish laundry and make a meal for the family and spend the evening relaxing or helping the kids with their homework. Another day, you have devotions, make your grocery list and go shopping. During shopping, you see deals on things you plan on getting, so you pick up the extra items to give to the food bank. At check out, you let the person behind you with only 2 items, go ahead of you. You smile and tell them to have a good day. As you check out, you greet your cashier with a smile, and when done, wish them a good day. Going home and unpacking groceries you set aside the items you brought for food bank and make the family meal and possibly zoom your evening Bible study. Some days you might have a morning Bible study to start your day or maybe you are on a committee and have a meeting to attend. You find change in your purse you drop it in the mite box for LWML. Your day may include a Ladies Society meeting or a Men's Fellowship get together. You may be asked to serve on Church council and say yes to a new experience. Remember last month I said, God does not call the qualified, He qualifies those he calls. There are so many ways you can be a good steward -- sing in the choir, fill a shoe box, join a group like a Bible study, join Ladies Society, LWML or, Men's fellowship. As you can see, living a life of stewardship is much different. Each Sunday in the bulletin, there is a list of stewardship opportunities. Check it out and watch the newsletter for more information on groups mentioned. Is there a way you can serve?
