These are just the ones that have been suggested to me or have come from my own thinking. I'm sure that each of us could imagine others. There is no uniquely 'right' answer to the question, "What shall we do?" and only one wrong answer: "Do nothing."

In order to discern what our next steps should be, we need to have conversations that are open to *all members and friends* of Holy Lamb. Acts 6:1-7 is just one example of Scripture addressing how and for whom the church does ministry. Beginning Wednesday, January 5th, we will study Luther's 95 Theses. This was the document that started the Reformation. In posting these 95 statements, Luther only intended to generate a discussion of some theological points that he believed needed to be corrected in the Roman Catholic Church. Of course, it generated much more than that.

We will look at the text of the 95 Theses but, more importantly, we will examine the context, meaning, and scriptural understanding of the theology behind them.

Women's Bible Study


