Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It's hard to believe that it is November already. That means we will soon be celebrating Thanksgiving followed immediately by Advent and Christmas. No, I am not one to decorate for Christmas before Halloween, nor do I play Christmas carols as soon as Thanksgiving is over. And of course, we won't be singing Christmas hymns until Christmas.

My point with this seemingly rambling opening is to encourage you to enjoy each season we are in to its fullest. That means take the time to relish all the unique features and aspects of each season, rather than simply check them off the list of holidays to get through until the next one. So, in the next paragraphs I'll highlight some opportunities to enrich your individual seasonal celebrations in the hope that you will be blessed, specifically by each season. If I might paraphrase, "Let's remember the reason for each season."

As our families change in size and age over the years, our traditions may also see some necessary changes. While the manner of celebrating may change, the focus of the celebration can remain joyful if it is grounded in our faith. So, as you consider the following seasons and your favorite traditions, give some thought to how any necessary modifications may still leave lots of room for joy.

Thanksgiving

Food and family are often major ingredients in Thanksgiving celebrations. After all, those are two things for which we are abundantly thankful. But if adjustments are necessary, it doesn't necessarily mean we have less for

which to be thankful. Perhaps we need to take a *new* look at the ways God continues to bless us. Consider starting with a blank piece of paper and begin by naming blessings that don't normally come to mind. Don't be afraid to begin, perhaps, with the joy of knowing that a loved one who is no longer with you is enjoying his/her eternity in heaven. Consider how this void in your life, sorrowful though it is, may be allowing a growth in other relationships.

Regardless of where you start or how you develop your list, remain focused on God's abundant blessings. And while we often consider, and our secular world encourages us to consider, our abundance of worldly blessings, don't pass up the opportunity to thank God for his greatest blessing – the gift of his son, Jesus, whose own death on the cross means that your death in this life is merely the gateway to a new life in heaven with him.

Advent

This season is so often overlooked because we are busy preparing for Christmas. Yes, Advent is, in fact, a season of preparation. But not in the way we usually think. The true preparation of Advent is a spiritual preparation. Along with all the necessary and appropriate preparations for events, guests, and gift-giving, Advent is a time to prepare our hearts for the greatest gift of Christmas – our Savior, Jesus.

Now I am not suggesting that meal planning, house cleaning, and Christmas shopping are somehow non-Christian activities. But along with all of these preparations, spending 45 minutes in worship on a Wednesday evening is a wonderful way to take a break from the other duties, take a rest from the breathless pace, and take a moment to consider why this gift we are about to receive was so necessary in the first place.

Abigail's Closet: Buy a Book / Donate a book:

We are starting a very short term ministry where a church member can buy a biblical Christ centered children's book and, under no obligation, donate a book to support Abigail's Closet.

The 4 books, which would make great Christmas and birthday gifts, are 'My Toddler Bible' for ages 1 -3 which costs \$10.00, 'A Child's First Bible' for ages 1 -3 which costs \$10.00 that is in both English & Spanish. Spanish books are the books that Abigail's closet is most in need of. The 'New Bible in Pictures for Little Eyes' for ages 4-7 which costs \$10.00, and 'Egermeier's Bible Story' for ages 8 and up, which costs \$16.00

We will be taking orders for the books after each service on November 6th, 13th, and 20th. There is also a weekly podcast that discusses that week's readings. We would love to have you join us! And whether or not you meet with us, this can be another easy way to develop a daily Bible reading habit. (For those men who are feeling 'left out', there is also a 'He Reads Truth' reading plan at the website!)

We are currently finishing our 3 week study of the book of **Hebrews**. Hebrews tethers believers to the past, present, and future, keeping our eyes on Jesus at every turn. Drawing on the richness of Israel's history and the forerunners of faith, we see how God was always pointing to the more perfect Priest and sacrifice that would come through His Son once for all time.

Beginning the week of November 7, we will spend 3 weeks looking at **Prayers in Scripture**. When we read God's Word, we find the people of God engaging in conversation with Him and growing in their knowledge of Him in the process. Though each prayer comes out of unique circumstances, emotions, and needs, all are offered to a God who hears and responds. Join us as we read narratives from both the Old and New Testaments of how God's people approach Him in prayer and what we learn about His character through speaking with Him!

Looking ahead to **Advent**: This year's reading plan is guided by the lyrics of the hymn " **Come Thou Long Expected Jesus**". Through this hymn, we will remember and celebrate the Son of God coming down to us, taking on humanity to be born as a baby in Bethlehem. And we will anticipate His future, triumphant return as the King of kings. Amid the hustle and bustle of the holiday season, this is one more way to prepare your heart for the coming of our Savior! 
