Some of the new opportunities available immediately are:

• New Tuesday Bible Study – We will look at the book of Isaiah, not all 66 chapters, but especially those that point to the Messiah, as well as those that our participants identify as being of particular interest to them. We will also have several copies in the Library, available for borrowing for the duration of the study.

We meet on Tuesdays at 9:00 and are also available via Zoom.

• New Sunday morning Bible study – We are going to look at the progression of the writings of John as he moves from the Gospel to the 3 epistles to the book of Revelation. It will be fascinating to see how he applies the unchanging theology of salvation through Jesus to the varying situations and challenges that the early church faced (and we still do today). We meet between services at 9:15.

Sunday Morning Bible Study

9:15 AM

We will not have a Sunday morning Bible study on New Year's Day. We will resume on January 8 with a unique study of the person of John, 'the disciple whom Jesus loved.' This came about as we looked at the Festival of John and realized that his writings – the Gospel, his 3 letters, and the book of Revelation – present an interesting study that reveals a progression of thought from the theology of the pure Gospel to the challenges of the early church to the hope we all share as revealed in Revelation.

This will be a short, fast moving study of a few weeks as we watch John move from the theology of the Gospel to the challenges of proclaiming that Gospel to the future promised in that Gospel.

Tuesday Morning Bible Study

9:00 AM

On January 3, we began a study of Isaiah – the Old Testament book that frequently promised the Messiah. While Isaiah has 66 chapters, we will limit our study to those chapters which have the more commonly known passages of promise and see what they meant in Israel's time and how they have been fulfilled in the person and work of Jesus.

This will be a wonderful, traditional look at the familiar passages we hear in Advent and Lent, as we dig into their relevance for us, today.


Women's Bible Study

The women's Thursday night Bible study meets Thursday evenings at 6:30 on Zoom. All women are welcome to join us! Use Holy Lamb's standard meeting code.

We are using the reading plans provided at www.shereadstruth.com You can find the daily Scripture readings and devotion at their website or sign up for their daily email or download their app. The website and emails are free; some of the plans on the app have a nominal charge. There is also a weekly podcast that discusses that week's readings. We would love to have you join us! And whether or not you meet with us, this can be another easy way to develop a daily Bible reading habit. (For those men who are feeling 'left out', there is also a 'He Reads Truth' reading plan at the website!)

The week of January 2, we begin a 5 week study on **The Life of Jesus**, focusing our reading on three of the four Gospels: *Matthew, Mark, and Luke*. Collectively known as the Synoptic Gospels, these three books of the Bible were written by three different people, from three unique perspectives, to record the life of Jesus on earth. We'll read about the different movements of Jesus's life and ministry, learning not just from what He taught, but how He lived. We'll see how Jesus —fully God and fully human—lived, how He responded to the people around Him, and how He interacted with God the Father. Together, we will look at Scripture to learn about Jesus and from Jesus, inviting His life to shape our own.


