Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

By now you should have heard that I announced my retirement effective June 30, 2023. Thank you for your kind words regarding my ministry with you and for your well-wishers as we enter retirement.

I was excited to see the turnout for the town hall meeting following worship on January 15<sup>th</sup>. I shared an explanation of the process of calling a new pastor and answered many excellent questions. Thank you for your participation and your interest in moving Holy Lamb forward into her next 'season.'

During these months leading to my retirement some things WILL NOT change:

- I will still be available for every pastoral need you have.
- I will still be preaching every Sunday except for vacation (and possibly the Florida hurricane response effort)
- I will continue to lead our Sunday and Tuesday Bible studies.
- In short, I will continue to be your full-time pastor. •

Beginning on July 1, Pastor Stephen Vogt will serve as Vacancy Pastor. He will assume as many duties of the office of Pastor as the congregation and he agree to. This conversation will probably begin in mid-May and will result in a contract that will continue for the duration of the vacancy.

During the entire time of the call process, Pastor Hank Hollar will work with the Call Committee and the congregation to ensure an appropriate, timely, and God-pleasing result. Pastor Hollar has previously served as a Circuit Visitor in Virginia and has a great deal of experience in guiding congregations through the call process. Holy Lamb is blessed to have him available for this service.

Another key aspect of the transition will be to address the many non-pastoral tasks that I have been accomplishing. These include: technology support for our hardware and software, troubleshooting printer issues before resorting to calling our vendor, audio support for our worship services (this is in addition to Sunday morning operation), video support for our worship livestream, and tablet preparation for our shut-in viewers. All of these technical tasks are better accomplished by someone other than the pastor. We have already begun some of this transition, but we have a need for more people to be involved – the tasks are easily separated and can be shared by several people. If you have a desire to help and a willingness to learn some limited technical skills, please contact me.

As we move through this time of transition, let us pray and trust that the Holy Spirit will guide the Call Committee, that He will lead members to step forward to assist in new ways, and that He will continue to lead new people to Holy Lamb to be nourished with God's Word and Sacraments.

#### **Sunday Morning Bible Study**

We are currently studying the unique person of John, 'the disciple whom Jesus loved. ' This came about as we looked at the Festival of John and realized that his writings – the Gospel, his 3 letters, and the book of Revelation – present an interesting study that reveals a progression of thought from the theology of the pure Gospel to the challenges of the early church to the hope we all share as revealed in Revelation.

This will be a short, fast moving study of a few weeks as we watch John move from the theology of the Gospel to the challenges of proclaiming that Gospel to the future promised in that Gospel.

#### **Tuesday Morning Bible Study**

On January 3, we began a study of Isaiah – the Old Testament book that frequently promised the Messiah. While Isaiah has 66 chapters, we will limit our study to those chapters which have the more commonly known passages of promise and see what they meant in Israel's time and how they have been fulfilled in the person and work of Jesus.

This will be a wonderful, traditional look at the familiar passages we hear in Advent and Lent, as we dig into their relevance for us, today.

It is a means of ceasing our striving and work to celebrate Him, to remember the gifts of His provision, and to enjoy His presence. We'll explore the biblical framework of rest and Scripture's invitation to intentionally and regularly lay down our striving for the sake of experiencing unhurried space with God.

Our <u>Lenten study</u>: **Your People Forever** begins the week of February 20. Join us in this seven-week study as we journey through the history of God's people in **I & II Chronicles**, rejoicing in the faith-fulness of a God who keeps His promises to a wayward people from generation to generation. Through reading these books of Old Testament history, followed by Holy Week readings, we will make our way to the cross and the empty tomb with a renewed sense of our risen King.
