# <u>March 2023</u>

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we engage in the necessary busy-ness of transition it is easy to become distracted from the essential ministry and mission of the church. Keeping mission and ministry 'front and center,' while adding all the tasks associated with the call process means that we will busier than ever. This is certainly true for my schedule as well.

Let me update you on some things regarding the transition that have already happened or are underway:

- Our audio/video wiring in the Fellowship Hall has been completed. We will no longer have wires strung across the floor to enable a Zoom conference call for Bible studies or meetings. This means that we will not need to move the wires when resetting the room for other purposes.
- Our Financial records and recording-keeping are being streamlined and reconciled to provide a more complete picture of our financial position. This process will be completed by our March Council meeting.
- Our computer systems (software and storage) are being updated and expanded to allow more efficient and productive operation and trouble-shooting.

Council determined that accomplishing these things will best position Holy Lamb for the opportunities to come. These steps might be considered 'filling in the potholes' in the road as we prepare for the journey. Yet to come are more tasks that might be compared to widening the road and improving access points.

More than just eliminating some negatives (potholes) these will have the impact of creating excitement for the future.

However, as I stated at the beginning of this column, our primary focus remains the mission and ministry of Holy Lamb – bringing the comfort, hope, and peace of the Gospel to bear in the lives of our members, guests, and the community. To that end, we continue to engage in our regular and occasional ministry actions:

• Our worship services continue, including our Lenten midweek services. This year we are looking at Places of the Passion, highlighting the various locations of the Passion narrative and what Jesus experienced, and why, at these various locations.

•One new feature this year is that I will be rotating with Pastor Josh Keinath from Risen Christ in leading our worship. Pastor Keinath and I will alternate between Risen Christ and Holy Lamb. Risen Christ's vicar, Tim Phanco, will also take one Wednesday.

- Our Bible studies on Sunday and Tuesday mornings continue.
- On Sundays at 9:15, we will look at Themes of Lent. Our Sunday morning topics are: Walking in the Wilderness, Relying on the Promises, Confessing and Repenting, Receiving and Sharing Forgiveness, and Fasting as a Reminder.

On Tuesdays at 9:00, we continue to study select chapters of Isaiah, the Old Testament prophet who delivered many of the well-known prophesies of the Messiah.

- We have a New Member Class meeting on Thursday evenings at 6:30 to instruct those who are, or may be, interested in joining Holy Lamb.
- And, of course, all of our administrative and support activities, which are necessary for our proper functioning, continue as usual.

# A Series of Services for the Season of Lent

Join us for the *Places of the Passion* special services beginning March 1 through March 29 as we follow in the footsteps of our Savior, contemplating the places where Jesus stood on his path to salvation.

**March 1:** We go to Bethany to remember that Jesus is anointed for burial by his friend Mary, at her home in this small town. We are called to prepare our hearts for Christ's death as well, while still looking toward the fragrant surprise of the empty tomb.

**March 8:** We go to the Mount of Olives, where Jesus went with his disciples to pray. We are called to find places to pray this Lent and seek the will of the Lord in our lives.

**March 15:** We head to Gethsemane where Jesus is betrayed and arrested in the garden under cover of darkness. We witness Jesus being taken away by soldiers, but we know that his journey toward the cross will take away our sins.

**March 22:** We go to the courtyard, outside of where Jesus is put on trial before the high priest and where Peter denies Jesus. We are called to confess that we often tend to distance ourselves from Christ, when we should be drawing closer to him.

**March 29:** We go to Pilate's Judgment Hall where Pilate is positioned here to set Jesus free, but turns him over to be crucified instead. We are called to remember that the judgment that should have been placed on us was placed on him that we might be free.


