Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Sunday's reading from Acts speaks of 3000 new converts being added to the church in one day. (I quoted it last Sunday and it will be in this Sunday's readings.) What a miraculous example of the power of the Word of God! What would Holy Lamb do if even 1% (30) of that miracle happened here?

As this is my last newsletter column, I would like to share some encouragement for Holy Lamb moving forward. Prior to Covid, we had seen a steady increase in attendance for many years. That growth leveled off as we reached a weekly worship attendance of 95-96 in 2018 and 2019. We bounced against that ceiling in 2012 & 2013, also. While our Sanctuary can seat over 120 if more chairs were added and every seat was occupied, such a crowd cannot be maintained – people are simply uncomfortable being that crowed every Sunday.

I fully expect that the excitement of a newly ordained pastor (some months down the road) will generate another increase in attendance. This is to be expected – it happened in the years following my arrival. In order to accommodate this anticipated growth, AS WELL AS PREPARE FOR EVEN MORE, Holy Lamb must take an objective look at both the capacity and functionality of our building. This is not simply saying, "We need a larger Sanctuary." Such a study will look at the way the building is used and seek to find improvements to traffic flow, etc.

Ultimately, such a study will result in some modifications and/or additions to the building. WHEN that time comes, there will be a strong desire to DO something, but will the funds be there? Of course, a capital fund drive at that time can raise significant funds for a building. And while that will be a wise and necessary step at that time, there is one thing that can be done immediately that can provide a firm foundation on which to build (pun intended) the resources to accomplish that construction.

We already have a Building Fund in our Dedicated Funds account. It is specifically limited to 'New Construction' activities, not merely remodeling or repairing the existing space. As long a new square footage is added, the Fund can be used for that purpose. But this type of funding is subject to the decision of Council and the Congregation. I am told that such a fund existed in the past. But as circumstances appeared dire, the congregation used those funds for General Fund expenses. This is not a criticism of that decision – it was made years before I arrived and I am in no position to comment on the decision.

As we begin to think in terms of building, though, it would be advisable to guard those funds more securely. Doing so would, hopefully, in a future time of financial distress, lead the congregation to other methods of dealing with the shortfall, rather than rely on the easy path of bleeding the Building Fund.

To that end, our Council, in conjunction with the LCMS Foundation, is developing an Endowment Fund for Holy Lamb's future building needs. Ron Hajduk and I met with Rev. John Denninger, a representative of the Foundation, to discuss how such a fund might be established. Unlike many endowment funds, this fund will allow the principle to be spent on appropriate building projects. At our May Council meeting, Council began to establish the criteria for such a fund. The foundation has been drafting a proposal for Holy Lamb to consider as a means to safeguard money that is contributed for building purposes, in order that it not be spent in other areas. This proposal may or may not be ready for the congregational meeting on June 11. If it is, I encourage that it be adopted. If it comes later, my encouragement remains the same.

There are advantages in establishing (and then contributing to) this fund. Holy Lamb has never called a pastor 'from the field.' A pastor who is called will come and visit Holy Lamb to 'get the lay of the land.' A short visit will reveal the many shortcomings of our building and the need to make some changes. Rather than merely acknowledge these shortcomings, an established and growing Building Fund will proclaim the message, "We know some of our needs and are prepared to DO something about them!" This message shouts, "We are excited about the future and are already taking steps to address our needs!" This excitement will be contagious, first within our congregation, second with our guests, and finally, it will be evident to the prospective pastor. Such excitement is more inviting than even a large, beautiful building, if that building is occupied by members with a lackluster attitude.

Holy Lamb has a very advantageous location – in the middle of a growing residential community with planned road expansion that will provide easy access from an even wider area. A dedicated and safe-guarded Building Fund is the ideal first step in preparing for the growth that I am confident God will provide.

We may not get 3000 in one Sunday, but I am confident that God has great things in store for Holy Lamb – well above what any of us can imagine today. I encourage you to plan NOW to be ready to reap the harvest that will come as the Holy Spirit works the miracle of faith in the hearts of hearers in the years ahead.

I pray God's richest blessings for all of you and for Holy Lamb.
