Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In this, my second-to-the-last newsletter column, I would like to share some thoughts about my optimism for Holy Lamb's future. Paul begins his second letter to the Thessalonians with these words, "We ought always to give thanks to God for you, brothers, as is right, because your faith is growing abundantly, and the love of every one of you for one another is increasing. Therefore, we ourselves boast about you in the churches of God for your steadfastness and faith in all your persecutions and in the afflictions that you are enduring. (2 Thess. 1:3-4)

Indeed, as I engage with other pastors in conversation about my coming retirement and the impact it will have on Holy Lamb, I assure them that Holy Lamb is more and better prepared now to respond to the challenges and opportunities ahead than at any time in her history. We have many new and newer members who bring a wealth of experience and energy to our leadership. We are in a better financial position than we have been for at least 25 years. And there are opportunities and resources

on the horizon that are not yet in full view. All these factors lead me to believe that Holy Lamb will thrive abundantly in the next 5-10 years. Which is a primary indicator that this is exactly the right time, *in Holy Lamb's journey*, for me to retire.

In order to accomplish all that God has in store for Holy Lamb, she will need a pastor as energized for the challenges as her leadership and resources require. I no longer have that level of energy. 17 years ago, when I accepted the call to serve as Pastor, I had thought that Holy Lamb was already in this position; and that God would accomplish the kinds of things I now envision. At that time, I had the energy for a myriad of initiatives. Instead, much groundwork needed to be done to restore broken relationships and restore confidence in our ability to sustain our ministry, not to mention expand it. The growth and strengthening of relationships and faith that has occurred over the last 17 years, to the exclusion of more visible growth and expansion, was not what I had expected would be the primary impact of my ministry. But it is what was necessary to prepare us for the future. And I consider it a privilege to have been God's servant in the process.

Going forward, the congregation, in concert with her new pastor, will need the freedom to consider all options without a concern of Pastor Panning looking over their shoulder. This is a 'best practice' procedure outlined by the synod and strongly encouraged by the district. I have seen churches where the retiring pastor did not follow this guidance and remained engaged in the congregation; I have *never* seen it work well. Having seen the disastrous alternatives, I am committed to being absent from Holy Lamb's mission and ministry activities, with a very few rare and explicitly identified exceptions. This is my choice to follow the synod and district's guidelines, based on my own experiences and observations of other situations.

My absence will be uncomfortable at first, at least as much for me as for you, but we will all get used to it. That will be necessary for all of us as we continue the journey God has in mind for us. Neither Holy Lamb, nor Kathy and I, will be able to move forward if our eyes are always on the rearview mirror.

But Holy Lamb and each of you, individually, will always be dear to us — in our thoughts and in our prayers. As Paul continued in that opening chapter of Thessalonians, "To this end we always pray for you, that our God may make you worthy of his calling and may fulfill every resolve for good and every work of faith by his power, so that the name of our Lord Jesus may be glorified in you, and you in him, according to the grace of our God and the Lord Jesus Christ." (2 Thess. 1:11-12)

Kathy and I pray that God will richly bless you, that Holy Lamb may fulfill all that God has in mind for her.

Making Disciples for Life Wednesday evening meal and Bible study 6:00 meal; 6:30 study

In early March, the LCMS held a conference titled "Making Disciples for life." The conference sessions were video-taped and our available for viewing by registered users. We have secured permission to view and present these videos and are offering a selection of them as our Wednesday evening Bible study.

To encourage and enable broader participation, we will also offer a light meal as part of the evening. Since we are preparing a meal, we ask that you register on the clipboard in the Narthex or by calling the church office or by emailing Pat Marquardt a t We will collect a nominal amount to cover the cost of the food. If you prefer, you may skip the meal and come for the video and the discussion.

The topics covered, range from the influence of the church in the public square, to mental health issues, to abortion, to youth ministry and teaching teens about life, health and family, and more. The presenters are a wide variety of individuals with backgrounds and experiences that will surprise and enlighten your understanding of the broad scope of issues. We will have a brief conversation following each video to share our impressions and consider how it might impact our lives and the lives of those around us.

This series will run from May 3rd through June 28th, as long as interest remains strong. Our initial topics and meals are listed below:

May3 - The Public Ministry in the Public Square:

Secularism claims a "wall of separation between Church and State." This false doctrine has largely succeeded in excluding the Word of God from the public square, and disintegrating Christian vocation. This presentation exposes the false doctrine and charts a course toward the reintegration of public and private Christianity.

May 10 - Martin Luther on Abortion and Matter of Words:

This presentation will look at Luther's Genesis commentary relating to abortion and how 'words matter in life matters'. A Biblical and Creedal overview will be highlighted referring to Luther's comments on abortion within the context of Biblical marriage, human conception, and procreation.

May 17 – Why Martin Luther's Perspective on Mental Illness is Still Useful:

Martin Luther was familiar with mental health problems, both personally and pastorally. This talk shows that his perspective is still relevant today. The women's Thursday night Bible study meets Thursday evenings at 6:30 on Zoom. All women are welcome to join us! Use Holy Lamb's standard meeting code.

We are using the reading plans provided at www.shereadstruth.com You can find the daily Scripture readings and devotion at their website or sign up for their daily email or download their app. The website and emails are free; some of the plans on the app have a nominal charge. There is also a weekly podcast that discusses that week's readings. We would love to have you join us! And whether or not you meet with us, this can be another easy way to develop a daily Bible reading habit. (For those men who are feeling 'left out', there is also a 'He Reads Truth' reading plan at the website!)

Beginning May 1, we will be reading the Old Testament book of **Daniel**. Daniel, a Jewish exile in Babylon, sought to honor God even as he lived in a land of false gods and under the rule of foreign kings. In this 3 week study, we see how *God is the King whose dominion is not shaken even in the most dire of circumstances* and we'll explore what it means to serve our faithful, unstoppable God.

This study will be a little different since our group chose to do the Daniel study during She Read Truth's first ever 'break' so there won't be the usual daily information on the website or in emails and the weekly podcast will not automatically 'drop'. But if you would like to join us on Thursday nights or just follow along on your own, please contact Kathy Panning (text 843-424-5257 or email katpanning@hotmail.com) and she will send the material to you.

Our group has found that reading Scripture regularly but at a slower pace has enabled us to see things we've never seen before (even during the familiar Holy Week readings!) and understand more fully how all of Scripture ties together in telling the one big story of God's love and plan of redemption. This is a great opportunity to become more familiar with the shortest of the 'major' prophetic books. Please consider joining us!
