Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

#### OF HYMNS AND HYMNALS



At the congregation's meeting on September 24, it was duly noted that there is some dissatisfaction with Divine Service, Setting Two. The irony here is that Pastor Steve's congregation in New Jersey disliked Setting One. The services are the work of the Inter-Lutheran Commission on Worship which met in the 1960s and early 70s.

**The ILCW** (as it was called) was composed of at least four members representing the Lutheran Church in America, the American Lutheran Church, the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Canada, and the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. Several mergers have left the LCMS the only survivor.

The movement toward a more contemporary and unified liturgical norm for Lutherans in America began with the realization that all our hymnals

were old and dated. **The zeitgeist**, *the spirit of the times*, brought the realization that our hymnals represented ethnic expressions no longer needed. Formerly there were German Lutherans, Norwegian and Danish Lutherans, Swedish. Finnish and Slovak; others too. But we were all now Americans. We wanted an American way of worship. The ILCW did an amazing job rewriting and producing new liturgical forms, and composing new hymns. Introducing these was another matter.

Lutherans were not alone, the zeitgeist does not work in a vacuum. Vatican II was playing out in the 1960s among our Catholic brothers and sisters. In the 1970s the Episcopalians were also at work revising their BOOK OF COMMON PRAYER.

The ILCW's work was slowly shared with the Missouri Synod through paperback booklets. The best thing they published was **the Three Year Lectionary**. The lectionary offered our churches a three-year cycle of readings. The Roman Catholics were working on a similar project; and it caught on; other protestant denominations adopted the three-year idea as well. The new lectionary replaced the one-year system we had used since the Reformation. God's people now heard more of the Bible read aloud in worship than ever before.

In the early seventies, some of our churches adopted **WORSHIP SUPPLEMENT** giving the LCMS a\_peek at things to come. This book available in red or blue, was designed to compliment.

THE LUTHERAN HYMNAL. It offered us new worship settings, and some fantastic new hymns.

At the Lamb's High Feast We Sing
At the Name of Jesus
From All Thy Saints in Warfare
I Bind Unto Myself This Day
In Adam We Have All Been One
Immortal, Invisible God Only Wise
Now the Silence, Now the Peace
O Love How Deep
Sing My Tongue
Thy Strong Word Did Cleave the Darkness

And many others that are now found in <u>LUTHERAN WORSHIP</u>.

Eventually the ILCW finished its work and published <u>THE LUTHERAN BOOK OF WORSHIP</u> (green cover). Not everyone in the Missouri Synod was happy with it and eventually the Synod opted to publish a revised version with a royal blue cover, <u>LUTHERAN WORSHIP</u>. Another book would take time to publish and some LCMS congregations refused to wait. They bought what came to be referred to as LBW. Once <u>LUTHERAN WORSHIP</u> was published Missouri Synod was using three different worship books.

Not mentioned so far is what we call Divine Service Setting Three. This is the Common Service which came to Lutherans from the nineteenth century and translated into English. It is the form of worship we learned from <u>THE LUTHERAN HYMNAL</u>. (By-the-way THE LUTHERAN HYMNAL was not well received when it was published in 1940. And, it was never made or declared the official hymnal of our Synod.)

What hasn't been said up to this point is that the service outline continues to preserve a Lutheran -ized version of the Latin Mass. Just as the sacred scriptures preserve for us the Word of God, so the Divine Service preserves among us Christian tradition and the Lord's Supper. There are some things you just don't play with. More on that next time: and I promise, not so long.


Lutheran Hour Ministries is a Recognized Service Organization (RSO) of the Lutheran Service Organization (122),
