### Of Bibles, Old and New August Newsletter + Holy Lamb Lutheran Church

*“[Remember] how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings which make you wise with regard to salvation....”*  
2 Timothy 3:15

My Bibles are a mess; but not all of them. As you can imagine a Lutheran pastor has a number of Bibles, in various translations. The ones that are well used, written in, highlighted, and whose spines are falling off are the ones I’m writing about. The last one whose spine is about to give way is itself a replacement.

Years ago I took the youth of my congregation to the LCMS youth gathering in Atlanta. A wonderful event, the kids had a great time. I had some free time and I noticed a booth collecting used Bibles needed help. I volunteered. Wouldn’t you know it? There were a good many Oxford Annotated Bibles (OAB), RSV being turned in. The OAB was at one time the standard for our Concordias. I was then on my second copy (which had already been rebound). A good many youth leaders and pastors had switched to the NIV.

At that time, the Oxford Annotated, RSV was no longer being sold. The *New Oxford RSV* and the NIV had cornered the market. But God had planted me in a very good place. When the workers came back to the booth from lunch I asked if I might make their group a donation in exchange for a couple of clean copies of the RSV. I went back to NJ sure that I had enough Bibles to take me to retirement.

In our congregation I had two ladies who still liked and used their King James Bible. I have no criticism against them, but in Bible class theirs was always the translation that stood out, awkwardly. On occasion I’d try to get them to switch, but they liked the Bible they were using. And then it dawned on me like an epiphany; **so did I**. I after all, came home from Atlanta with two Oxford RSV Bibles like the one I used in college and seminary. I didn’t want to change, just as they didn’t. Why?

The first reason is that my Post-It Notes, my under linings, high lightings, and other notes were all over that old book. It represented my seminary education. In that book alone I knew right where to find certain important verses. It be on a page in the New Testament where I had spilled my coffee. On a given page I had penned an alternate translation to something Paul had written. And of course, at least half my sermons were wrapped up in the notes of that old beaten-up Bible. Why would I get rid of it?

Now my Concordia Self-Study NIV also looks a little shoddy, the pages a bit dingy, the paper cover long gone. That NIV with my RSV sit at my desk at home, side by side, companions, as if they'd gone through a war together. I still check them from time to time. These days I carry in my bag a smaller ESV, the English Standard Version.

The English Standard Version (ESV) promises to reflect the Hebrew and the Greek original texts faithfully. So far I find that to be so. The ESV also continues in the tradition of the King James Version and the Revised Standard Version Bibles, so that users of either should feel rather comfortable with it. The one criticism we hear of the ESV is that the translation is somewhat stiff and wooden. It doesn't flow easily, especially when read aloud at Sunday worship. You may notice that I soften the rough edges when I read it.

Not everyone comes to Bible class, though I would strongly urge your participation. You are missing out on the friendly discussion of topics that or may not have been planned. The women's group back in NJ met every Thursday afternoon. I left them be, lest my presence stifle their discussion. I did notice however, every now and then the laughter that emanated from that room; Spirit-inspired laughter. It was good.

Bible class, regardless of which translation you bring with you to class, always holds the promise of fellowship and being able to learn from someone else, their insight, their experience. And you'd go home the wiser. And how about this, you have insights to share with others. What are you withholding from your brothers and sisters.

Those old Bibles on my shelf, ---oh, if they could talk.

## 2024 Hurricane Preparedness

We are in the hurricane season. There are steps we can take to protect ourselves and our possessions.

- \* First and foremost, it is important to monitor local weather reports and follow advisories from local authorities about preparation and evacuation.
- \* Know your zone.
  - Zone A**  
All areas east of Business 17 up to the intersection with US 17
  - Zone B**  
All areas east of US 17 bypass to US 17  
All areas south of Hwy 707 and Longwood Drive  
All areas in Longwood Plantation (Blackmoor sub division)
  - Zone C**  
All areas between Hwy 701 and Hwy 544  
All areas east of Hwy 31 to Hwy 90  
All areas east of Hwy 90 to US 17 in northern Horry County line
- \* Develop a family disaster plan.
- \* Prepare an Emergency Supply Kit. Make sure to stock or restock not perishable food items and replace batteries.
- \* Put copies of important documents in a safe place, preferably a water tight container.
- \* If you have prescription drugs, make sure to document the RX number, name, address and phone number of the pharmacy where you fill your prescriptions. Also record your administering doctor's name and phone number.
- \* Create an evacuation plan. Know your evacuation route and decide early when you will leave and where you will go.
- \* **Identify an out-of-area emergency contact.**
- \* Fill up the gas tank in case you have to evacuate.
- \* Have enough cash on hand for a few days because ATM's may not be available due to power outages.

Holy Lamb maintains an **Emergency Contact Sheet** for each of our families. An elder will be contacting you to update your information or complete a new sheet.

### A Note from the Property Manager
