Epiphany: A Season of New Beginnings

As the calendar turns to January, we step into a new year filled with fresh opportunities, resolutions, and hope for what lies ahead. east came to Jerusalem, saying, 'Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we saw His star when it rose and have come to worship Him." These wise men represent the nations coming to Christ, showing us that the light of Jesus is not confined to one people or place but is for all.

As we consider the story of the Magi, we see a model of faith and new beginnings. They followed God's star into the unknown, trusting that it would lead them to the King. If you are purchasing flowers for our altar, please use the Flower Fund envelopes from the Flower Chart bulletin board and place in the collection plate or drop off at the church office.


