#### The Four Pillars of the Early Church

As I reflect on the life of the early church recorded in Acts 2:42, I'm struck by the simplicity and strength of their community. Picture it: a small, dedicated group of believers gathering in homes, united by their faith in Jesus. They were not focused on grand buildings or elaborate programs; their strength lay in their devotion to four simple yet profound practices: the apostles' teaching, fellowship, the breaking of bread, and prayer.

What must it have been like to sit in those gatherings? To listen intently as the apostles shared the teachings of Jesus—His parables, His miracles, His death, and His resurrection. These teachings were the bedrock of their faith, and for us, they remain preserved in Scripture and summarized in the Apostles' Creed. When we confess the Creed today, we stand in that same tradition, declaring the timeless truths of our faith.

Imagine the warmth of their fellowship. These early Christians didn't just see each other once a week; they shared their lives. They broke bread together, not just as a meal but as an act of communion, partaking in the body and blood of Christ in the Eucharist. It was a moment of unity, a tangible reminder of Jesus' sacrifice and the grace He freely gives.

And then there was their commitment to prayer. These were people who turned to God in everything—lifting up their joys, their needs, their fears, and their thanksgiving. Whether it was the beautiful simplicity of the Lord's Prayer or the heartfelt cries of their hearts, prayer connected them to their Heavenly Father and to one another.

These four practices weren't just rituals; they were lifelines. They gave the early church strength to persevere, even in the face of persecution and hardship. They built a community bound not by convenience but by the shared mission of living as disciples of Christ.

Now, as we gather here at Holy Lamb, I see these same pillars in our own church life. When we gather to hear God's Word and confess the Creed, we are grounded in the apostles' teaching. When

we enjoy the fellowship of a potluck or lend a listening ear to a fellow believer, we are living out the community of faith. When we kneel at the altar to receive the Lord's Supper, we are nourished and united by Christ Himself.

And when we join our voices in prayer, we echo the devotion of those early believers, trusting in the same God who is faithful and present in all things.

This month, I invite you to step deeper into these holy habits. Take time to reflect on the Apostles' Creed and the truths it proclaims. Reach out to someone in the church to share in fellowship. Approach the Lord's Supper with a renewed sense of awe and gratitude. And make prayer a daily practice, whether it's the Lord's Prayer or your own personal petitions.

Let us, like the early church, devote ourselves to these four pillars. May they shape our lives, our congregation, and our witness to the world. Together, we can be a community rooted in Christ, drawing strength from the practices that sustained the earliest followers of our Lord.
