St. Augustine: A Voice from the Past That Still Speaks Today

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

When we speak of the Reformation, our minds naturally turn to Martin Luther and that fateful day in 1517 when he posted his 95 Theses. But behind Luther stood a long line of faithful voices, none more influential than St. Augustine of Hippo. Though he lived over a thousand years before Luther, Augustine helped shape the theological ground on which the Reformation would one day stand. His life, writings, and conversion continue to speak powerfully into our faith today.

Augustine was born in 354 A.D. in North Africa. He was intellectually brilliant, but spiritually restless. For years, he sought fulfillment in philosophy, fame, and pleasure. His mother, St. Monica, was a devout Christian who never ceased praying for her wayward son. Augustine dabbled in different religions and schools of thought, but none could satisfy the ache of his soul. His big "revelation moment" came when he heard a child's voice say, "Take and read, take and read." He opened the Scriptures and his eyes fell on Romans 13:13-14:

"Let us walk properly as in the daytime, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and sensuality, not in quarreling and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires."

In that moment, God opened Augustine's heart to the transforming power of grace. He left his old life behind and was baptized by Ambrose of Milan in 387 A.D. From that point forward, Augustine became one of the Church's most powerful voices for the truth of God's Word.

His writings, especially Confessions and The City of God, still resonate today. Confessions is not only the first spiritual autobiography in Christian history, but also a raw and honest look at the human soul's journey to God. It reminds us that the path to salvation is not about earning God's favor, but about being transformed by His mercy. The City of God offers deep insight into how Christians live in a broken world while longing for the eternal Kingdom. It is as relevant in our complex modern world as it was in the chaos of the collapsing Roman Empire.

For Martin Luther, Augustine was a trusted guide. Luther was an Augustinian monk, and it was through Augustine's writings that he learned the true depth of sin, and the even greater power of God's grace. Augustine's teaching on the bondage of the will, the necessity of grace, and the supremacy of Scripture paved the way for Luther's rediscovery of the Gospel.

Why does Augustine still matter? Because, like Luther, we live in a world full of searching souls. We see Augustine's story echoed in the lives of people around us, restless hearts trying to find peace in all the wrong places. His famous quote still rings true, "You have made us for Yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You."

At Holy Lamb Lutheran Church, we are privileged to carry forward the same Gospel Augustine embraced and Luther rediscovered, that we are saved by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone. Augustine reminds us that no one is beyond the reach of God's grace, and no mind too great or heart too lost to be redeemed.






Family Game Night

If you would like to reserve a spot, please sign up on the flower chart on the wall in the Narthex. The cost is \$40.




Men's Fellowship meets every second Tuesday of the month at 11:30 AM. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, July 8th.
