This is what theologians call *natural revelation*, the fingerprints of God seen in nature itself. Thomas Aquinas, one of the great minds of the Church, wrote at length about this. He believed that all creation bears witness to the Creator's glory, that reason and observation alone can lead us to the recognition of a divine hand behind it all. St. Paul echoes this in Romans 1, writing that "what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them. For His invisible attributes... have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world" (Romans 1:19–20). In other words, to reject God is not a lack of evidence, it's a lack of observation.

So as you head outside this summer, whether you're biking, gardening, grilling, or just sitting on a porch watching the world go by, take a moment to notice the world God made. Pay attention to the small wonders. Marvel at the intricacy of life. Give thanks for the wisdom of ants, the glory of sunsets, and the joy of being alive in a world created by our Father.

Of course, summer in Myrtle Beach also means *crowds*. Roads get busier, restaurants fill up, and finding a parking space can feel like its own parable in patience. But those crowds also remind us why we're here. They represent families reconnecting, grandparents seeing grandkids, friends reuniting after long absences, and they remind us of the vital ministry we offer here at Holy Lamb Lutheran Church.

So this summer, enjoy the gifts of friendship and family. Take joy in the work God has given you to do. Watch the ants. Marvel at creation. And above all, stay grounded in the One who made it all and holds it all together, our Lord Jesus Christ.

The cost is \$40.00.


