The Gift of Rest: Rediscovering the Sabbath in the Heat of August

August in Myrtle Beach is a time of intense sunshine, bustling schedules, and, for many, the subtle realization that summer is winding down. As families take final vacations and prepare for a new school year, it's easy to become consumed by what needs to be done: back-to-school shopping, doctor appointments, final projects, and financial planning. But amid all the activity, God gently calls us to something different: rest.

In his Small Catechism, Martin Luther explains the Third Commandment: "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy." Luther explains: "We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it."

Sabbath, then, isn't about mere inactivity. It's about a sacred rhythm, a time set apart not only to stop working, but to reorient our hearts to God, to listen to His Word, to gather with the Body of Christ, and to remember who we are: beloved children of the Father, redeemed by the Son, and sanctified by the Spirit.

In many ways, the American culture has reversed this rhythm. We are money -rich but time-poor, constantly told that productivity equals value and busyness equals importance. Compared to much of the world, Americans have less vacation time, fewer shared meals, and increasingly less church

involvement. The very time that could renew us, time with God, time with family, time with our church family is what often gets sacrificed first.

But what if we reversed that? What if we saw time with God not as a luxury, but as a lifeline?

At Holy Lamb Lutheran Church, we believe that Sabbath is not simply about Sunday morning, though that's certainly where it begins. It's about creating space in our hearts and homes for the Word of God to dwell richly. It's about meals shared without phones, prayers whispered in the quiet of evening, and worship services that remind us we are not alone on this journey. As fellow sojourners, we walk together - not just through Myrtle Beach sand - but through every valley and mountaintop of life, strengthened by the grace that comes through Word and Sacrament.

This August, as the heat slows us down just enough to catch our breath, may we be intentional about rediscovering the Sabbath, not as a rule, but as a gift. You're invited to worship, to reconnect, and to rest in the arms of the One who says, "Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28).

It is hard to imagine "excelling" to mean anything less than giving the 10% that God commanded in the Old Testament.






THE PUMPKINS ARE COMING!!
