Love in Action

In Luther's Small Catechism, the explanation of the First Article of the Creed says that God "gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I have. He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life." God is the ultimate giver of all that we have. To acknowledge these gifts and our dependence on the Lord, God calls us to give a portion of our income back to Him through our financial offerings. As the hymn says: "We give Thee but Thine own" (Lutheran Service Book #781). Indeed, the Scriptures are very clear: Christians are to give generously to support the work of the Church, which God has established to preach the gospel and administer the sacraments.

During the month of October you will see an increased focus on stewardship at Holy Lamb Lutheran Church. As a part of this process, we ask that you reflect on God's word (see the special bulletin inserts during the first few weeks Of October and prayerfully consider how you intend to financially support Holy Lamb during the coming year. Pledge cards will be distributed in the upcoming weeks, and you will be asked to fill them out and return them on (or before) **October 19th**. We encourage participation by everyone who regularly attends Holy Lamb. Your response will enable the church to create an accurate budget, so that we can be good stewards of the resources entrusted to it, just as you are called to be a good steward of the resources entrusted to you.

The message of the Gospel is that Christ has entirely paid for your sins and made you holy before God. No amount of money you give can merit Gods favor. With this in mind, we see that financially supporting the church is simply a joyful response to the priceless gift of salvation that we have already received. Your giving enables the church to continue to fulfill its mission of proclaiming the Word of God. So, as you consider how to allocate and spend your income each month, Christians do well to remember that Jesus says "where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Matthew 6:21).


Thanksgiving Day Potluck
