Finding Our Way in the New Year

If you've ever been on the beach in Myrtle Beach during turtle season, you may know the story. Tiny hatchlings break free from their nests, instinctively heading toward the sound of the surf and the reflection of the moon and stars on the water. It's a breathtaking sight, life beginning its journey, drawn by the call of the sea. But sadly, many never make it. Artificial lights – streetlamps, porch bulbs, and billboards – confuse them. Instead of following the call of the ocean, they wander inland toward glowing distractions, only to be lost.

What a picture this is of our own spiritual journey, especially as we step into a new year. Like those turtles, we are meant to follow the steady sound of the waves – God's Word calling us, guiding us, and leading us to life. Yet how easy it is to be pulled away by the bright lights of our culture: endless advertising, worldly success, self-centered goals, and voices promising fulfillment apart from Christ. They shine, they dazzle, and they distract. And before we realize it, we're moving in the wrong direction.

The good news is that God has given us His own illumination to follow. His Word shines "*a lamp to our feet and a light to our path*" (Psalm 119:105). Even more, He draws us by the light of His Sacraments. In Holy Baptism, He has marked us as His own. In Holy Communion, He feeds us with Christ's true body and blood for forgiveness, life, and salvation. These are the lights that will never mislead or confuse. They do not pull us away from Him; they draw us closer.

This January, we are invited to set the tone for the year ahead. Not by making resolutions that fade in weeks, but by setting our hearts on Christ who never fails. Ask yourself: What light will I follow in 2026? Will it be the flashing glow of the world's billboards? Or will it be the steady radiance of God's promises?




GIFT-a-VET

Items were collected, sorted, boxed and delivered to Veterans Nursing Homes in Columbia, Sumter, Walterboro, and Florence.




Holy Lamb Mens Fellowship Club meets the second Tuesday each month.
